

Shenango River Watchers to Unveil Fishing Pier

SHARON, Pa. — A ribbon-cutting ceremony is planned for 5:30 p.m. Tuesday at the new wheelchair-accessible fishing pier in Bicentennial Park.

Shenango River Watchers this week announced completion of the fishing pier, a \$58,000 project that has been in the making for nearly 14 years.

"We are so excited that the pier is now complete. We have always seen the potential of this wonderful asset, our river. However there were too many people who could not enjoy it due to physical limitations" said Jennifer Barborak, one of the founders of the Shenango River Watchers.
